## 4.2 Account Transactions Report

Treasurer reported that receipts into the General Account between 1st April and 31st May totalled \$2,325.00 in membership fees and \$0.29 in interest with no expenditure recorded for this period. The CCS Account recorded interest of \$0.49, also with no expenditure for this period.

At the committee meeting held on 13th June, it was resolved that invoices received from Hostaway for \$149.00 for web hosting and domain name registration, from Town of Bassendean for \$216.00 for 2022 hire of Alf Faulkner Hall and from Keith Wall for \$103.41 for reimbursement of expenses for the period 16/12/2019 to 12/07/2021 while acting Treasurer be paid.

#### 4.3 CMC Tax Returns

Treasurer reported that the tax figures had been sent to the accountant who will prepare tax returns as soon as reasonably practicable.

### 5. REPORTS

#### 5.1 Technical Subcommittee

Murray Lizatovich reported on the current activities of the Subcommittee with respect to concessional licensing schemes and decisions delegated from the Management Committee under CMC Rule 50. He advised that the revised Code 404 Handbook remains with DoT for review. The subcommittee is currently assessing a Porsche for eligibility for licensing under the Unique and Historic category of Code 404.

Aileen Stockdale (VCCC) asked about the use of photographs to check vehicles for Code 404 eligibility in lieu of an inspection for remote club members. Murray advised that he was hopeful that a satisfactory resolution with DoT on this issue is close.

Stuart Elvidge (CMRC) raised a query about vehicles on concessional licensing where the owner of the concessionally licensed vehicle dies and their spouse is not a financial member of the approved club and therefore is ineligible to have the vehicle licence transferred to their name. Murray noted that transfer of vehicle ownership can only be done following grant of probate and agreed that this is an issue. Stuart noted that there is a DoT form available to facilitate licence transfer where the owner has died, however Murray advised that this applied mainly to Executors. Dean Roberts suggested that in these circumstances the club could grant membership to the spouse to enable transfer of the concessionally licensed vehicle once probate is finalised.

#### 5.2 Classic Car Show

Dean Roberts reported. An event wrap-up from Premiere Events was previously forwarded to member clubs with the agenda. The monetary return to the CMC from the 2022 CCS was \$9,359.09 comprising a lump sum payment of \$5,500 plus 10% of gate and online ticket sales and an invoice has been sent to Premiere Events. This was a good result given that 4 weeks prior the event was on the verge of being cancelled due to COVID restrictions on events and public gatherings.

At the committee meeting held on 13th June, it was resolved that the 2023 Classic Car Show be held on Sunday 26th March 2023 at Ascot Racecourse. It was further resolved that a formal agreement with Premiere Events be prepared, for the committee's formal endorsement, for the event management of the annual Classic Car Show for a 5 year period, with an increasing annual return to the CMC over this period. A letter proposing the terms of this agreement has been sent to Premiere Events.

The Chair noted that one suggestion for future events is to bring back 'themes' for the event and invited suggestions for themes from member clubs. Darren Williams (TW4 visitor) advised that the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Land Rover will be next year. Dean advised that he was happy to continue to be the CMC liaison person for the Classic Car Show with Premiere Events.

## 5.4 Motor Museum

Patric O'Callagan (MMWA) reported that the Motor Museum has started to see an increase in interstate and international visitors and entry numbers are 14% up on last year's figures. In the last couple of months, the CTCCWA, VWCWA, HSVOCWA, CCWA & ACE motoring clubs have visited the Museum as club groups at a reduced entry fee. All monies received go back into the Museum.

Patric noted that Blair Allsop, an expatriate Canadian, last year gave the Museum a \$1.4 million gift of over 12,000 die-cast automotive models and this will be housed in a specially built display cabinet set comprising separate units to form the largest display of model cars in the southern hemisphere. Sponsors and donations are needed to fund the fabrication of this display furniture and donations are invited from CMC member clubs. Doug Bush asked whether a donation from the CMC would be able to offset the CMC's contingent tax liability and it was agreed that this should be investigated. Patric further advised that more volunteers are needed, particularly on weekends, as guided tours of the Museum are intended to be initiated.

### 6. MEMBERSHIPS

## 6.1 Applications

There have been no new membership applications received.

## 6.2 Membership Status

There are currently 103 financial members. Membership renewal payments are being received from member clubs before the due date of 30<sup>th</sup> June. Members noted that as at 13th June, 48 member clubs had paid their 2022/23 membership fees by EFT or cheque.

The Secretary advised delegates that a Membership Update form would be emailed to member clubs in July ahead of the AGM and requested clubs to ensure that their details, particularly the names of delegates, are current.

## 7. GENERAL BUSINESS

## 7.1 Club management software & website

The Secretary reported that building the new website is progressing but will take some time. Implementation of the WildApricot system will be done on completion of the website build.

## 7.2 Motor Show digitisation

The Chair reported that the Motor Museum has 3 hours of Motor Show available to view. The content has been edited to Show segments focussed mainly on classic and historic vehicles.

#### 7.3 Amendments to Rules of Association

Proposed amendments to the CMC Rules were considered by the committee at its meeting on 13th June and subsequently provided to member clubs. A Special Resolution to adopt the amended Rules is proposed to be put to member clubs at the AGM, which will require that notice be given at least 21 days prior.

Terry McGrath (JCCWA) asked that a copy of the current Rules be sent to him and the Secretary agreed to do this. The Secretary further advised delegates that the current Rules are downloadable from the CMC <u>website</u>.

## 7.4 Use of 'surplus' CMC funds

At the general meeting held on 18th April, delegates resolved that the suggestion from the JMAWA be received and that all other suggestions from member clubs be collated for future discussion and resolution.

Additional submissions were received since the April GM from the Association of Citroen Enthusiasts and the Jaguar Car Club of WA and these have been added to the suggestions from member clubs.

Ron Flood (COWA visitor) asked if there is a defined amount of funds that are surplus. Dean Roberts advised that this depended on the CMC's tax liability which is not yet known.

The Chair reminded delegates that the use of any surplus funds must be in accordance with the objects of the CMC.

## 7.5 CMC response to Climate Change

The Secretary advised that no further progress had been made to date due to the time involved in the CMC website build.

## 7.6 Annual General Meeting

The Chair noted that management committee positions would again be subject to election at the AGM to be held in August and encouraged delegates to consider nominating for a position. All positions except the Treasurer and Secretary, who were elected last year for two-year terms, will be open for nomination. The Chair also noted that Dean Roberts intends to nominate for President which would require him to relinquish the Treasurer position.

## 7.7 National Motoring Heritage Day

Peter Carter (RMCOWA) asked whether the National Motoring Heritage Day run could be reinstated. The Chair agreed that this was a worthwhile aim and it could

be discussed at the AGM. However, he also noted that this was held on the third Sunday in May which is the annual date for the British Car Day in Gingin organised by the JCCWA.

## 8. NEXT MEETING

The next meeting will be the Annual General Meeting to be held on Monday 15th August 2022 at 8pm in the Alf Faulkner Hall, Corner of Ivanhoe Street and Mary Crescent Eden Hill.

#### 9. CLOSE

As there was no further business the Chair closed the meeting at 8:55pm.
